


The meeting of the Intergovernmental commission, business-forums and a national industrial exhibition of Uzbekistan were successfully held.

In the course of the negotiations particular attention was paid to expanding trade and economic cooperation.

The importance of implementing coordinated measures for bringing the volume of trade to \$2 billion based on the adopted "roadmap" was underlined.

Expansion of the nomenclature of goods within the framework of the Preferential Trade Agreement, mutual simplification of phytosanitary and quarantine requirements, customs procedures, convergence of standards, integration of electronic trading



utilizing the transit potential.

It was noted with satisfaction that over the past few years the volume of cargo transportation through the multimodal corridor "Uzbekistan-Afghanistan-Pakistan" has increased by 5 times.

In order to further increase the volume of cargo turnover, an agreement has been reached on establishing a joint transport and logistics company.

The importance of coordinating joint efforts for practical promotion of the Trans-Afghanistan railroad construction project was also stressed.

An agreement was reached to hold the next meeting of the Intergovernmental Commission in July this year in the city of Lahore.

The sides advocated for further expansion of cultural, humanitarian and tourist exchange. In this context, it was agreed to hold mutual cultural weeks and presentations of tourism programs.

An exchange of views on the current international and regional agenda was also held. The importance of continuing mutual support within the framework of the United Nations, Non-Aligned Movement, Organization of Islamic Cooperation, SCO and other multilateral structures was highlighted.

The President of Uzbekistan and the Prime Minister of Pakistan emphasized the need to join efforts in the fight against terrorism, radicalism, radicalism, Islamophobia and other contemporary security challenges.

In order to elaborate new areas of comprehensive cooperation, it was agreed to establish the Supreme Council of Strategic Partnership and hold its first meeting next year.

As a result of summit talks a decision was made on developing and approving a joint "roadmap" for the timely implementation of the agreements reached and signed.

In the beginning of the meeting Prime Minister of Pakistan Shehbaz Sharif expressed sincere gratitude to the President of our country for the warm and cordial welcome.

In 2024 the trade turnover exceeded \$400 million, the quantity of joint enterprises reached 130. Trade houses are open in Karachi and Tashkent. Direct flights between

The plans of leading companies to implement cooperation projects in pharmaceuticals, electrical engineering, agrarian sector, agricultural machinery, geology and mineral resources, textile, leather and other industries were reviewed.

In order to encourage business and cultural contacts between the regions, the Head of our state suggested organizing a Forum of Regions of the two countries in Uzbekistan.

New City in Uzbekistan to Be Named After the Great Babur Whose Legacy is a Symbol of Shared Heritage for Uzbek and Pakistani Nations

n a move that deeply resonates with the hearts of millions across Central and South Asia, the President of Uzbekistan, Shavkat Mirziyoyev, has announced that the newly built city in the Andijan region will be named after Zahiriddin Muhammad Babur, the great founder of the Baburid Empire and a beloved historical figure for both Uzbeks and Pakistanis.

President Shavkat Mirziyoyev emphasized the exceptional legacy of Zahiriddin Muhammad Babur - a great thinker, poet, and statesman. To honor Babur's profound contributions to science, literature, and culture, and to immortalize his memory, President proposed naming the newly built city "Babur City".

"Babur Mirza was a worthy successor of the Timurid Renaissance, a patron of science, culture, arts, and literature. His remarkable legacy glorified our people around the world. Building a city that carries his name is a symbolic realization of his lifelong dream,"

said the President.

For Pakistan, where Babur's legacy lives on through centuries of history, architecture, and culture, this is a profound gesture of unity and shared heritage.

Andijan, the birthplace of Babur, is one of the most densely populated areas in Uzbekistan. With 10% of the nation's population residing in just 1% of its territory, the government launched a visionary project in 2021 to build a new city to ease urban pressure and provide modern living standards. This bold project is being constructed in eight phases on 4,000 hectares of previously unused land.

Already, 63 apartment blocks, a modern school for 1,680 students, a kindergarten, a medical center, a light industry enterprise, and an affordable housing center have been completed. The essential infrastructure, including roads, water supply, gas, electricity, and heating, has been fully established. A new reservoir and distribution station have also been launched to supply clean drinking water.

The future city named after Babur is planned as a modern and technologically advanced

urban space, deeply rooted in cultural and spiritual values. Central to its development will be a large educational complex, which will include kindergartens, schools, a university, a museum, a library, and an IT park. The city will also feature a world-class sports facility.

Significant attention is being given to environmental and recreational spaces. Among them is the "Yangi O'zbekiston" Park, which spans 19 hectares and is planted with over 10,000 trees, offering visitors scenic areas for rest and a spacious amphitheater for cultural events. Another key site is "Vatanparvar" ("Patriot") Park, where visitors will find the "Oath to the Homeland" monument, a museum dedicated to patriotism, and various performance venues.

A grand monument to Zahiriddin Muhammad Babur will be built at the city's highest point, symbolizing his spiritual return to the land of his birth.

Speaking to the youth, President of Uzbekistan Shavkat Mirziyoyev emphasized the importance of education, innovation, and hard work:

"The youth of Uzbekistan are talented and capable. When does talent reveal itself? When there is effort. Seek knowledge and strive to grow - then your tomorrow will be bright."



A special development program with a funding commitment of \$250 million has been approved to bring the city of Babur to life. Once completed, it will be home to over 410,000 people, offering a vibrant environment for living, learning, and growth.

New Babur City is more than a development milestone - it is a tribute to a shared past and a vision for a collaborative future between Uzbekistan and Pakistan.

Babur, the ancestor of the Baburid dynasty, left a legacy of art, poetry, architecture, and governance that shaped South Asian history. Uzbekistan's tribute reaffirms the deep

cultural bond between the two brotherly nations. As Babur longed for his homeland, this city stands as a homecoming - an eternal reminder that our histories are intertwined.

"As is well known, wherever in the world, in whichever country Zahiriddin Muhammad Babur found himself, he longed for his homeland throughout his life. I believe you will agree that today the dream of our great ancestor has come true – it is as if he has returned to his native land once again. I congratulate all of us on this historic event!" the President said.

Visits Pakistan to Strengthen Bilateral Tourism and Economic TiesIslamabad, Pakistan -



■ Developing new cross-border tourism routes that highlight the shared spiritual,



in regional connectivity and sustainable development."



One highlight was the Pakistan-Uzbekistan Business Forum, which convened prominent business leaders from both nations. The Forum facilitated targeted B2B interactions and underscored mutual economic interests, setting the stage for significant MoUs and agreements in key sectors like textiles, agriculture, pharmaceuticals, and electrical engineering. These efforts aim to elevate bilateral trade from its 2019 level of \$122 million to a projected range of \$300-\$387 million by 2024-25. Uzbekistan's fruit and vegetable exports to Pakistan reached \$192

million in 2024, confirming the promising trajectory of economic ties.

Crucially, the long-anticipated Uzbekistan-Afghanistan-Pakistan Railway Project was a key topic, emphasizing the strategic vision of linking Tashkent and Peshawar through Kabul—a 573 km corridor poised to transform regional logistics and trade flows.

Broader Regional & Diplomatic Context

Beyond bilateral gains, the visit contributes to wider regional integration. Enhanced transit connectivity with Uzbekistan opens routes not only to Central Asia but also to European and Middle Eastern markets. Moreover, strategic alignment strengthens regional diplomacy through platforms like the SCO and ECO.

PM Sharif's trip came on the heels of visits to Azerbaijan and Tajikistan, demonstrating Islamabad's intensified diplomatic engagement aimed at balancing regional relations and articulating Pakistan's narrative amid rising tensions with India.

In Summary

This visit marks a watershed in bilateral relations. By committing to a High-Level Strategic Partnership Council, launching significant economic mechanisms, and advancing transport corridors, Pakistan and Uzbekistan have set a clear roadmap for long-term cooperation. The agreements and diplomatic momentum generated promise economic prosperity and stronger geopolitical synergy—on a local, regional, and international stage.

Their campaign began with a 4-1 thrashing of Thailand, followed by a tough 2-1 victory over China, securing early qualification to the knockout stage and a

Recent changes in the issuance of "Golden Visas" to foreigners, particularly foreign investors, for residency in our country have generated considerable interest among the general public of Uzbekistan, in the media, and on social networks.

So, what exactly is the "Golden Visa" program, and what benefits will this project bring to the economy of Uzbekistan and to foreigners? To find answers to these questions, we studied documents on procedures related to this system.

Specifically, the decree of the President of Uzbekistan Shavkat Mirziyoyev "On Measures to Stimulate Production, Export and Entrepreneurial Activity, Improve the Efficiency of Trade and Industrial Policy," adopted

on April 18 of this year, mentions the issuance of "Golden Visas."

This issue is outlined in paragraph 26 of the decree. According to the document, in order to stimulate investment, from June 1 of this year, citizens of foreign countries and stateless persons will be issued a residence permit in Uzbekistan for a period of 5 years in a simplified procedure for 150,000 USD for each family member (spouse, children, and parents).

The "Golden Visa" program aims to create favorable conditions for foreign investors, provide legal guarantees, and strengthen the country's investment climate. It also

makes a significant contribution to the country's openness, capital protection, and the development of stable international economic relations.

It should be emphasized that over the past eight years, despite the contradictions in the world, the pursuit of an open and pragmatic foreign policy has become Uzbekistan's hallmark on the world stage.

Our country has become a favorable place for foreign investors. It would not be an

exaggeration to say that Uzbekistan, with its growing economic potential, is in this regard the most attractive destination in Central

Of course, in order to win the trust of foreign investors, it is necessary to provide them with the necessary conditions, opportunities, and benefits. This approach is common not only in Uzbekistan but all over the world.

Currently, especially against the backdrop of global challenges in the world economy, the competition for investment is intensifying worldwide. Investors choose countries with favorable conditions and a safe investment environment, because they want to see reliable legal protection for their money.

Seven or eight years ago, leading companies were hesitant to invest in Uzbekistan, because the rights of investors were not sufficiently ensured. However, since 2017, Uzbekistan has been implementing radical reforms to create a favorable investment climate. Guarantees of the rights of private owners, including investors, have been updated and even strengthened in our Constitution. In addition, a number of resolutions and

decrees of the head of state, and corresponding documents of the Cabinet of Ministers, aimed at stimulating foreign investment have been adopted in recent years.

The result was not long in coming. Wherever you go in our country today, you will

encounter new investment projects and joint ventures. They serve the prosperity of our country, the well-being of the population, the creation of new jobs, and the construction of social facilities.

The Tashkent International Investment Forum, established in our country on the initiative of the head of state, has become a tradition and generates great interest on an international scale. In addition, the Foreign Investors Council has been created. The main tasks of the Council are to provide advisory assistance on the most important areas of investment, trade, technological, and innovative development of our country based on successful experience and

international practice, as well as to ensure an open dialogue between the government of Uzbekistan and foreign investors. The first session of the Council in 2022 laid the foundation for the effective functioning of this mechanism.

In May 2024, the second plenary meeting of the Foreign Investors Council under the President of Uzbekistan was held within the framework of the III Tashkent International Investment Forum. It expressed confidence that with the support of the members of the Council, Uzbekistan will continue to demonstrate high growth rates, improve the living standards of our people, and ensure a prosperous future for our country.

In his speech at the III Tashkent International Investment Forum, the President of Uzbekistan expressed his support for foreign investors: "We have taken decisive steps towards a radical improvement of the investment and business environment in the country, and the gradual elimination of all barriers. The large-scale reforms we are implementing are aimed precisely at ensuring that every investor feels free and confident."

Over the past seven years, more than \$100 billion in foreign investment has entered our country. A law on public-private partnerships has been adopted, and more than a thousand projects have been put into operation. We have launched our own production of 1,800 new types of products.

Another initiative to issue "Golden Visas" to foreign investors will also pave the way for accelerating the attraction of foreign investment to our country.

Foreign investors working in our country

also highly appreciate the largescale reform program in New Uzbekistan. In their opinion, the comprehensive support of the head of our state for investment activities and his determination to continue mutually beneficial cooperation deserve high recognition.

"The active dialogue between President Shavkat Mirziyoyev and members of the government with foreign investors is of great importance. This approach has become a clear and convincing signal to stimulate the attraction of foreign direct investment for the economic growth and development of the country. The modern conditions and new initiatives in your country have

shown that Uzbekistan is a country ready to receive foreign direct investment. Also, the economic reforms carried out by the head of your state, in particular, the liberalization of the foreign exchange market, the liberalization of the banking sector and monetary policy reforms, the restructuring and privatization of state-owned enterprises and much more, give confidence and strength to foreign investors. During our meeting with the President of Uzbekistan, he listened carefully to all my investment plans and gave clear and prompt instructions to provide all the necessary assistance to the relevant persons. As a result, we invested about 400 million dollars in sugar production. We also attracted an initial investment of more than 20 million US dollars for gold and copper mining," - says Naguib Sawiris, founder of the leading Egyptian investment holding company Orascom.

According to experts, similar visa programs are widely used in international practice, including in countries of Europe, the United States, the UAE, Singapore, and others.

In particular, the Golden Visa program in Portugal sets a fee of 250-500 thousand euros, in Greece - 250 thousand euros, in Cyprus - 300 thousand euros, in the UAE - 550 thousand dollars, in the USA - 5 million dollars, in Spain - 500 thousand dollars, in Singapore - 7.7 million dollars, in Hungary - 250 thousand dollars, in Latvia - 60 thousand dollars.

This program has proven to be an effective means of attracting capital, technology, and business activity to the above-mentioned countries. The issuance of "Golden Visas" creates a favorable and predictable

environment for foreign investors, provides legal guarantees, and strengthens confidence in the investment environment. The innovation reflects the country's strategic focus on openness, capital protection, and the development of stable international economic relations.

Some countries offer "Golden Visas," and some even grant foreigners full citizenship through "Golden Passports." Their goal is to attract capital and wealthy foreign investors to the country.

Central Asian countries are also introducing the procedure for issuing "Golden Visas." In particular, new rules for obtaining such a visa came into force in Kazakhstan in April of this year. Individuals who have invested at least \$300,000 in the authorized capital of Kazakh companies or in locally issued securities can apply for a visa. Later, they can obtain a residence permit for a period of 10 years.

In short, the "Golden Visa" program is aimed at attracting foreign direct investment for the technical re-equipment of the national economy, the modernization of production, the privatization of state-owned facilities, and the creation of new jobs in the regions of the republic where there is a workforce.

Location and Geography




This is one of the highest mountain neighborhoods in Uzbekistan, situated 80 kilometers from the city of Shahrisabz and near the border with Tajikistan.





These include the International Organization of Turkic Culture (TURKSOY), headquartered in Ankara, Turkey, established on July 12, 1993, to revive cultural and humanitarian ties among Turkic-speaking peoples. TURKSOY is a scholarly and educational organization that promotes Turkic culture through various international projects. It highlights key cultural contributions by commemorating significant figures from Turkic culture annually. Among its important initiatives is the annual naming of a cultural capital of the Turkic world from among member countries. The jewel of our country, Khiva, has already been honored with this prestigious title.



Our country possesses an ancient history, a rich culture, and centuries-old traditions and customs. Leveraging its cultural potential in foreign policy has become one of the key aspects of building a positive image of the Republic, enhancing its international authority, and efficiently addressing both internal and external political challenges. This is why our country actively employs cultural diplomacy in its foreign policy, which is based on mutual respect, the exchange of values, art, and traditions. Experts in international relations describe cultural diplomacy as a strategic tool that forms long-term contacts between peoples and influences the perception of a country on the global stage.

key objectives are the preservation and promotion of Turkic heritage, the advancement of Turkic languages, and support for cultural exchanges and joint events.

It is important to emphasize that the foundation of the OTS lies in a shared language, religion, and historical and cultural ties, which help amplify the voices of member states on the international stage and promote the values of their peoples. It is no coincidence that among the organization's priorities, in addition to fostering trust and friendship among members, are the expansion of cooperation in science, education, culture, and tourism.

Another organization working under the auspices of the OTS and focusing on cultural initiatives is the Turkic Culture and Heritage Foundation, headquartered in Baku, Azerbaijan. It was established at the initiative of the Azerbaijani side in August 2012 to develop projects aimed at reviving, developing, and promoting the culture and historical heritage of the Turkic peoples.

Promoting important cultural and humanitarian initiatives through affiliated OTS structures (TURKSOY, TurkPA, the International Turkic Academy, and the Turkic Culture and Heritage Foundation), with an emphasis on Uzbekistan's special historical role in the Turkic world, is one of the priorities of our country's foreign policy. This

active approach is no coincidence: on the ancient land of Uzbekistan lived great scholars and thinkers, writers and theologians who made tremendous contributions to the development of global civilization. Al-Khwarizmi, Ahmad al-Fergani, Abu Rayhan al-Biruni, Ibn Sina, Mirzo Ulugbek, and many others left a brilliant mark in history, and the works of the genius Alisher Navoi still serve as a unifying force within the Turkic world.

President Shavkat Mirziyoyev, speaking at the informal OTS summit on March 31, 2021, especially emphasized: "Special attention should be paid to the deep study of our peoples' invaluable contributions to the development of secular sciences and their rich cultural heritage, the conduct of various research, and their promotion worldwide." In the six years since joining the OTS, Uzbekistan, together with the organization's Secretariat, has held a number of major events: the international conference "The Role of the Kokand Khanate in the Development of Statehood and Cultural Heritage of the Turkic Peoples," the first Forum of Young Entrepreneurs with over 250 young businesspeople from OTS countries, and the 4th Forum of Young Leaders in Bukhara, which was named the first Youth Capital of the Turkic World. At Uzbekistan's initiative, the International Alisher Navoi Prize for contributions to unity in the Turkic world was established.

The year 2022 proved particularly active, as our country hosted over ten major events, including the First Meeting of Ministers of Agriculture and the Turkic Agroforum. In December 2023, Uzbekistan successfully held the international conference "Jadids: National Consciousness, Ideas of Independence and Statehood."

Tashkent supports a comprehensive strategy to bring OTS countries closer together by relying on shared historical roots and a rich cultural heritage, and it aims to develop projects in education, innovation, and tourism. One such example is the implementation of the Union of Turkic Universities and the Orhun Exchange Program within the OTS framework. These initiatives enhance academic mobility and strengthen scientific cooperation.

Today, OTS countries possess tremendous institutional and practical potential for expanding multifaceted cooperation. Moreover, initiatives in the cultural and humanitarian spheres provide opportunities to showcase national achievements and heritage, while jointly creating platforms for cultural dialogue and knowledge exchange. The initiatives put forward by Uzbekistan

within the OTS are constructive and are not attempts at dominance or the creation of "bloc alliances." Such a pragmatic and balanced policy by Uzbekistan opens new dimensions for the development of regional and international cooperation, laying the foundation for mutually beneficial relationships with foreign partners in the fields of economy, trade, industry, investment, and business.

The development of interstate relations within the Organization of Turkic States demonstrates that ethnic, linguistic, and geographic commonality serves as a solid foundation for building strong political, economic, and cultural ties. Based on these shared motivations, countries in the region are striving to establish reciprocal foreign trade communications as a priority, provide mutual support in accessing markets and transit routes, and resolve other related issues

The initiatives proposed by President Shavkat Mirziyoyev at OTS summits, aimed at promoting Uzbekistan's culture and the priceless heritage of its ancestors, who are the pride of the entire Turkic world, deserve particular attention. In speaking of great poets such as Jalaluddin Rumi, Yunus Emre, Yusuf Khass Hajib, Nizami Ganjavi, Magtymguly, Firoghi, and Boborakhim Mashrab, the President noted that the legacy of these cultural figures is a shared spiritual treasure of all Turkic peoples.

Speaking recently at the informal summit in Budapest, President Shavkat Mirziyoyev emphasized: "The in-depth study and global promotion of the legacy of our great ancestors, who made a tremendous contribution to world science and culture and are our pride, is an honorable and responsible task for all of us. In our efforts to develop science and expand educational

opportunities for the younger generation, we have enshrined in the Turkic World Charter the high spiritual principle: 'There is no salvation except through knowledge.'" The President also introduced new initiatives. One of them is the establishment of the International University of Turkic States in Tashkent. It is expected that leading professors and scholars from Turkic countries will work at this university, contributing significantly to intellectual potential and creating new opportunities for youth.

It is important to understand that over the past few decades, the global cultural landscape has changed significantly, increasing the demand for the development of cultural and humanitarian ties. In today's world, where economic and political tensions often arise, it is culture that holds the greatest potential to overcome differences, enhance mutual understanding, and improve international relations. The promotion of cultural diplomacy principles is essential for strengthening ties between countries and supporting global sustainable development. It contributes to the preservation and promotion of heritage, facilitates the exchange of experience and knowledge, and creates new opportunities for creative development and mutual understanding.


